

Why the idea came from our **Cairo University Center?**

Thalassemia Patients present the highest number in our center.

- The numbers are increasing continuously.

Our studies showed a very high carrier rate (5.5 > 9%)In Egypt.

- 1000/1.5 million live birth/yr are born with thalassemia.
- Lack of population, physicians and government awareness to the disease.
- Lack of sufficient resources to support the medication, blood and needs of the patients.
- Motivation and support of TIF on their visit to our center in 1990.

Goals:

- 1. To improve the quality of life and survival of our patients by Medical support by improving the availability of blood and all essential medications.
 - Social support to their education and employment. Financial support in social events and religious occasions
- 2. Improvement of the population awareness to the disease.
- 3. Increase the physician awareness to the diagnosis, management and prevention of thalassemia.
- 4. Support the medical and research activities in the domain of thalassemia


Achievements

- Supporting the availability of medications and motivation for blood donation. motivate the government to support their treatment including oral iron chelators and all interventional procedures including Bone Marrow **Transplantation**.
- Regular meetings annually in the international thalassemia day since 1999 for all the physicians and patients in special session to meet the International and national expertise in the domain of their disease.
- Printing and distributing booklets to the patients and young physicians on thalassemia.
- Supported the establishment of thalassemia centers in different governorates of Egypt

Achievements in The Domain of Education and Employment

- We initiate and support the issue of the ministerial decree No 60 in 1999 for the employment of patients graduated or not in the governmental or nongovernmental jobs (by 5%) (50 certificate issued / yr from ETA).
- We initiate and support the issue of the ministerial decree for the right of the patient to go to the school or the University convenient to them beside their residence disregarding the graduation level.
- Financial support to the patient to complete their education













Achievements for Prevention of Thalassemia

- To implement a compulsory law for premarital screening (Not yet in Egypt). Minimize the number of thalassemics born yearly in Egypt..
